**Tax Collection.** Homestead benefit adjusted tax bills are being processed and mailed. You will receive a blue and yellow adjusted bill in the mail by the April 12, 2019. The credits are being applied to the second quarter (May 2019). It is important to note that homestead credits are applied to the property and cannot be transferred or otherwise altered due to any change in homeownership. Second quarter tax payments are due later that May 10, 2019 to avoid penalty. Payments can be made on at the Tax Office on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor or left in the drop box. ## Bulk Pickup



Bulky waste consists of items such as old furniture, bedding, carpeting, pool covers and metal items such as bicycles. No waste materials of any kind that are generated from commercial activities or businesses, including handyman, repair services, retail store, offices, real estate agencies, landlords, contractors, agricultural enterprises.

Effective March 1, 2019 Public Works will only be collecting household trash. All bulk items will be collected on Friday in the following areas:

**Burlington County Shredding and Recycling Event will be Held on Sunday April 28, 2019 from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm,** rain or shine, at the Burlington County Resource Recovery (Landfill) Complex, located at 22000 Burlington-Columbus Road in Florence Township. No **E-WASTE** can be brought to this event. Bring only "confidential" documents such as bank and credit card statements, tax returns and papers with account numbers. No binders, plastic folders, computer disks or credit cards will be accepted. Up to four bags or boxes per car will be accepted. Previously shredded paper can also be recycled at this event. Burlington County staff will unload cars. Proof of Burlington County residency required. ## Did you know?...

### April Fools' Day around the World!

- The day is called Poisson d'Avril in France. This means "April Fish". Kids tape a paper fish on their friends' backs and yell out "Poisson d'Avril" when their friends finally find it!
- In England they use other words for fool such as "noddy" or "gobby".
- In Scotland they call the day "Hunting the Gowk".
- In Portugal they celebrate by throwing flour in their friends' faces.
- In Spanish speaking countries such as Spain and Mexico April Fools is celebrated on December 28<sup>th</sup>, the Day of Holy Innocents.

**Composting** is a natural process where organic materials decompose and are recycled, known as "compost". Why should you compost?

- Composting saves money on fertilizer, water use or plant amendments
- Save time bagging grass and leaves
- Composting helps the environment by reducing volume of garbage going to landfills, reduces chemical inputs and aids in erosion control
- Reduces the volume of garbage going to landfills, transfer stations and incinerators
- Improves soil structure, moisture retention and plant growth
