Distracted Driver Enforcement Campaign- During the month of April Eastampton Township is partnering with the Burlington County Sheriff's Department in the "Distracted Driver Enforcement Campaign". As a reminder NJ State law requires you to use hands free devices while operating a motor vehicle.



Woodcrest Drive Roadwork

- Between Monday, March 29th and Monday, April 5th curbing work will begin on Woodcrest Dr.
- Door hangers will be placed on residents' doors in the immediate vicinity 48-72 hrs. prior to the work starting.
- The curbing work will take up to 2 weeks, weather dependent, and the road will be open during this time.
- Milling and paving will begin in the middle of April, and the exact date has not yet been determined.
- The milling and paving work will take about 10 days, and the road will be closed during this time. Local residents, buses, police, fire, EMS, USPS and trash trucks will be allowed access.
- All work will take place Monday through Friday during the hours of 7am-4pm.
- As of Sunday, March 28th residents are advised to move all vehicles, trailers and motorcycles from Woodcrest Dr. and park on side streets or utilize the Cliver Park parking lot.

Photograph - Must be a photo of any native trees(s) to New Jersey or a photo of a natural scene such as a park, lake, or naturalistic landscape in Eastampton. **Judging will be in categories grades 6-8.**

Entry Submissions and Forms – All contest entries for categories will be first judged by the **Environmental Advisory Committee** and narrowed down to the top three in each category. The **top three** in each category will then be posted on the Eastampton Facebook page for voting beginning **on April 26, 2021.**

The artwork or photo with the most votes will be the **First-Place winner**, those with the next highest votes will be the **Second-Place winner**, and those with the third highest votes will be the **Third-Place winner**. Each category winner will receive a gift card.

All photos must be submitted as a **JPEG or PNG file**. 2017 HOMESTEAD BENEFIT PROGRAM

Many N.J. homeowners will receive property credits on their May 1, 2021 real estate tax bills. A **revised 2nd quarter bill** will be mailed to all applicants that filed for this credit and were eligible. These credits are for the full amounts for the Year 2017. Please wait to pay your 2nd quarter if you filed and were eligible as credits cannot be refunded or altered due to ownership as per the State of NJ. You may also view your account on our website www.eastampton.com

**** If a homeowner was eligible but have since moved the credit will still be applied to the property***

SENIOR FREEZE- PROPERTY TAX REIMBURSEMENT

Eligibility Requirements- You must be at least 67 years old, or you were receiving Social Security disability payments on or before December 31, 2019.

You have lived in NJ continuously since at least December 31, 2009

2019 income was less than \$91,505, 2020 income was less than \$92,969
